

France and the Western Balkans' EU membership

23 March 2021 – 11am

Open Society Foundation for Albania is inviting you to the open online event on the French role in the EU integration process of the Western Balkans to be organized on March 23, 2021 between 11.00-12.30.

At the approaching European Council meeting, scheduled for the 25th and 26th of March 2021, the question of the Western Balkans' EU integration process is expected to once again take a back seat to the more urgent subjects, such as health crisis and vaccination delays. A seemingly endless path towards the Union membership has become even more dubious in recent years, especially after October 2019 when some EU member states blocked the opening of the EU accession negotiations with North Macedonia and Albania. The voice of the official Paris was among the strongest in denying the two countries from moving forward with their membership bids, and President Macron has unequivocally rejected the idea of the EU enlargement in the foreseeable future. With France due to hold the presidency of the European Council in the first half of 2022, and with both the Presidential and Parliamentary elections scheduled for next year the upcoming months may be the pivotal moment to revisit and reconstruct the French role in the EU integration process of the Western Balkans.

During this event on **March 23, 2021** two joint sessions will be organized. A first session with the welcoming remarks, and a second session will be French view about the Western Balkans' place in the EU. During the event will be presented the results of the new study 'French Public Opinion on EU Membership of the Western Balkans' prepared by Open Society European Policy Institute in cooperation with think tank D Part as it may be checked [here](#).
