## Bios of the panelists

**Mr. Andi Dobrushi** is Executive Director of Open Society Foundation for Albania and Regional Coordinator for Open Society Foundation in Western Balkans. Mr. Dobrushi is well known and highly respected figure in Albania and the region, including among the civil society and the diplomatic circles. Besides managing and leading the philanthropy activity, Mr. Dobrushi has a rich national and international experience also as attorney. He has worked in European Roma Rights Centre in Budapest, European Court of Human Rights and Minority Rights, United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights, Council of Europe, European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights, Norwegian Center for Human Rights, OSCE, and so on.

**Professor George Pagoulatos**, General Director, Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP). Mr. Pagoulatos has been a member of the ELIAMEP Board of Directors since 2013, Vice-President in 2019, before being appointed Director General of ELIAMEP in November 2019. He is a Professor of European Politics and Economy at the Athens University of Economics and Business (AUEB) and Visiting Professor at the College of Europe in Bruges. He was Senior Advisor and Director of Strategy at the PM Office under Prime Ministers Lucas Papademos and P. Pikrammenos in 2011-12. Mr. Pagoulatos is a member of the Governing Board of the European Policy Centre (EPC) in Brussels since 2015. He served as member of the High Council of the European University Institute in Florence (2010-13), and President of ECSA-Greece (2013-14). He is a regular columnist in the Sunday edition of the main centrist newspaper Kathimerini since 2007. Mr. Pagoulatos holds degrees from the University of Athens (LLB) and the University of Oxford (MSc and DPhil), where he was a Rhodes scholar. His research and publications focus on the EMU and the EU, Southern European and Greek political economy, economic governance, political economy of banking and finance, political economy of reform. He has extensive experience in providing advice and analysis on the Greek and the Eurozone political economy.

**Mr. Maklen Misha** is Advisor to the Minister for Europe and Foreign Affairs, covering political issues and economic diplomacy, with a wide expertise both in the public and private sectors.

**Mr. Alexandros Bouzis** is currently serving as Head of the Public Diplomacy Office of the Embassy of Greece in Tirana. Has served as Head of the Press Office of the Ministry for Migration in Athens. Has served as a Public Diplomacy Officer at the Embassies of Greece in Nicosia and Paris. Has served as member of the Department monitoring the Cyprus Issue in Athens. Mr. Bouzis obtained a bachelor's degree in Communication and Mass Media from the University of Athens; Master's Degree in European and

International Affairs from the University of Athens; and is a Graduate of the National School of Public Administration of Greece.

**Ms. Alketa Berzani** has 15 years of research experience, currently holding the position of Senior Research Consultant at Savanta UK. Till Feb'21 she was the Managing Director of Data Centrum and the project leader for implementing this study in Albania.

Mr. Ioannis Armakolas is Assistant Professor of Comparative Politics of Southeast Europe at the Department of Balkan, Slavic and Oriental Studies, University of Macedonia (Thessaloniki) and 'Stavros Costopoulos' Senior Research Fellow and Head of the South-East European Programme at the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP).
